Dear Families

As we settle into the school term, we'd like to remind everyone about the importance of school zone safety to help keep our students, staff, and community safe.



- Slow Down School zones have a 40 km/h speed limit during designated times. Always be aware of signage and drive carefully.
- Be Alert for Pedestrians Children can be unpredictable. Stay vigilant, especially near crossings and pick-up/drop-off areas.
- **U turns** Illegal U turns in a school zone are dangerous and will get you a fine of \$387 and 3 demerit points.
- You must not stop your vehicle in a Bus Zone unless you are driving a public bus. Penalty from \$344 and 2 demerit points
- Double Parking Double parking is very dangerous in a school zone and will get you a fine of \$387 and 2 demerit points.

NAPLAN

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is a literacy and numeracy



assessment that students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 sit each year. It is the only national assessment all Australian students have the opportunity to undertake. As students progress through their school years, it is important to check how well they are learning the essential skills of reading, writing and numeracy. NAPLAN assesses the literacy and numeracy skills that students are learning through the school curriculum and allows parents/carers to see how their child is progressing against national proficiency standards. NAPLAN is just one aspect of a school's assessment and reporting process. It does not replace ongoing assessments made by teachers about student performance, but it can provide teachers with more information about students' educational progress. NAPLAN also provides schools, education authorities and governments with information about how education programs are working, and whether young Australians are achieving important educational outcomes in literacy and numeracy. We are currently preparing for NAPLAN at our school.

As always, if you have any concerns regarding your child's education, please feel most welcome to speak with your child's teacher in the first instance, or the respective Assistant Principals (Mr Prior, Mr Delaney, Mrs Sack) or myself.








From the P&C


Focus on Positive Behaviour for Learning




